The Franciscan Saints

Each week between August 11, the Feast of St. Clare, and October 4, the Feast of St. Francis, we will highlight an individual who was inspired by the humility, simplicity of life, closeness to the poor, and spirit of prayer of St. Francis. These stories are found in the book The Franciscan Saints by Robert Ellsberg.

ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, OFM CONV

Saint Maximilian Kolbe (1894-1941), entered the Franciscans at the age of 16 in Poland. In February 1941 he was arrested and, by May, he was on his way to Auschwitz, the notorious Nazi camp. He passed the time leading his fellow prisoners in prayer, preparing them for death.

In July, a prisoner escaped and in retaliation 10 inmates of cellblock fourteen were selected for death. When one prisoner cried out that he would never see his family again, Fr. Kolbe offered to take his place.

In 1982, Pope John Paul II, who as bishop of Krakow had often prayed at the site of Kolbe's death, presided over his canonization in Rome. Present for the ceremony was the man whose life Kolbe had saved.



GETTING TO KNOW ST. CLARE OF ASSIST

St. Clare's story continued...

In 1224 Clare suffered a serious illness that forced her to remain bedridden for much of the remainder of her life. She continued to function as Abbess and worked at cloth making, providing corporals and altar linens for churches in Assisi.

The story is told that in 1240 Saracen troops surrounded Assisi and also San Damiano. The Sisters approached Clare seeking protection and help. She gathered them in prayer and proceeded to confront the enemy with a pyx containing the Blessed Sacrament, asking God to preserve them and the city of Assisi. The Saracens withdrew without causing damage.

In 1247 Pope Gregory's successor, Pope Innocent IV, provided a new Rule for all the monasteries of the Order of Saint Damian, binding the Sisters to its observance. It was a milder form than Hugolino's Rule of 1228. The reference to observe the Rule of St. Benedict was replaced by a reference to the Rule of Francis along with the three vows of Poverty, Chastity, and Obedience. It mitigated fasting and permitted them to receive, to have in common, and to freely retain possessions. Clare realized that she would not be able to accept these norms.

She then begins to draft a new Rule in order to preserve the original vision of Gospel Life that she and Francis had shared and the Privilege of Poverty she had received. Her Rule offers a combination of the fruits of common life shared by Clare and her Sisters at San Damiano and those directives that would insure papal approval. When quoting Hugolino and Innocent, she



added phrases such as "except for a useful, reasonable, evident and approved purpose." Chapter 6 is the heart of this Rule which incorporates both the "Form of Life" and the "Last Will" of Francis. She completed the Rule by 1251. When passing through Assisi, Raynaldus of Ostia, Cardinal Protector of the Sisters and future Pope Alexander IV, visited Clare and gave his signature of approval. Still she sought the approval of Pope Innocent.




