


lenten Message by Father Rey Bersabal

Whenever we enter into the season of Lent, we think about ashes, penance, and fasting. As praise worthy as these practices may be, there are other practices that fulfill the spirit of the season.

The sixth chapter of Matthew reminds us how Jesus was telling his disciples about fasting and without being glum. **"Anoint your head and wash your face".** This is how we get ready for work and for the rest of the day. Our fasting should be integral to our daily routine. For those workholics and those giving up on chocolate or wine for Lent, it would be better if we can fast from work and spend more time with family. Other than giving up on things, we can extend our generosity to those in need.



Prayer Before the Crucifix

St. Francis prayed this prayer before the crucifix in the little church of San Damiano in 1205/1206, in the early days of his conversion:

Most High, glorious God, enlighten the darkness of my heart and give me true faith, certain hope, and perfect charity, sense and knowledge, ord, that I may carry our Your holy and true command. WE ADORE You, O Christ, AND WE PRAISE YOU.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from Meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all of the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older. Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics 18 to 59 years old. The traditional norm for fasting is to eat only one full meal. Smaller meals throughout the

day, if all added up, should not be more than one full meal.


