




HOPE IN THE TIME OF TROUBLE

Those who look to God are radiant; their faces are never covered with shame.

Our evening reflection will offer some perspectives as to hope we might discern in the midst of the conflict and division in our World today. We will recall the words and strategy of Pope Joh the XXIII who confronted the "prophets of doom" at the beginning of the Second Vatican Council. The Council itself offered us hope by emphasizing the presence and expectation of the Kingdom of God as something greater than the Church itself. This "Kingdom of God" is unfolding in our time by a restored understanding of the Church as the people of God living in the World as a source of that justice which gives birth to peace. The developing sense of the Church as a Synodal people of discernment continues and implements the work of Vatican II. Finally, we will confront some of the issues of our day with the intent to discern a sense of direction based on hope and not a false sense of optimism.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from Meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all of the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older. Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics 18 to 59 years old. The traditional norm for fasting is to eat only one full meal. Smaller meals throughout the

day, if all added up, should not be more than one full meal.




