A SHARED CHARISM

From the beginning of St. Francis Parish in 1895 we have honored St. Francis of Assisi as our Patron Saint. Before the turn of the century Franciscan scholars came to the understanding that the Franciscan message has been too dependent on Francis alone. Reflecting on the relationship between Clare and Francis, they have come to the realization that the Franciscan Charism is collective. This relationship includes not only Francis and Clare but their relationship with the Brothers and Sisters and to the Lay People, penitents of the time.

While Clare was inspired by Francis, and they shared a common vision, she was the recipient of a powerful charism of her own, a gift bestowed by the Spirit of the Lord and given to her in a fullness and forcefullness that was hers alone. That charism matched with the equally full and forceful charism of Francis unleashed a mighty power of example and of hope for people who wanted to live an authentic Christian life. This shared charism of Gospel life was rooted in the experience of God and the Incarnate Christ, based on unity of the Spirit and lived in the world of gift with Sisters and Brothers, radically following the Gospel of Jesus within the Church.

During the 27 years between the death of Francis and her own, she became the living witness who strongly shaped the understanding of Francis' heritage, and became a creative innovator of Franciscan Life in the Church. After his death, she maintained connection with the Friars, several of whom were part of Francis' inner circle. While some of the Brothers were looking to provide for the future and facing conflicts within their ranks and with the Church, Clare was casting her care upon the Lord, professing faith in God's Providence and Francis' vision.

In Genesis 2:18 God said: *"It is not good for man to be alone; let us make him a helper like himself."* And in this way Clare was elected by God to be his partner and soul mate. How blessed are we to be trustees of this joint Franciscan spirituality!

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Soon St. Clare will join her soul mate in this church.

Starting last week we began praying the the **Angelus** during weekday masses. The Angelus is a devotion commemorating the Incarnation of Christ. The name Angelus is derived from the first few words of the text: *Angelus Domini nuntiavit Mariæ* ("The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary"). The Angelus is usually accompanied by the ringing of the bell, which is a call to prayer - and to spread goodwill to everyone. Enjoy the bell.


