

A CELEBRATION OF FELLOWSHIP, FOOD & FUN

The FRANCISFEST Committee is pleased to report the following information to our fellow parishioners.

Father Rey directed us to have two primary goals for FrancisFest:

• First and foremost, the festival was to be a community builder in the wake of the pandemic. More than 250 parishioners, representing over 50% of regular church goers, attended the event. Additionally some 50 church members volunteered their time and talent to make FrancisFest a success. Many more donated baked goods, garden plants, books and items for the various retail booths. Best of all, everyone had fun!

• The second goal was to raise revenue to help meet our parish's budgetary needs. To that end, St. Francis of Assisi Parish grossed **approximately \$17,000**. The Committee worked diligently to keep costs to a minimum – there were **only \$3,000** in **expenses**. Special thanks to parishioners and friends who loaned us tables, tents, umbrellas and even the use of their pick-up truck without cost. By comparison, the August 2022 Gala drew about 100 people and netted \$16,000 after expenses.

Our hope is that FrancisFest will be back and even better in 2024! Look for live entertainment, more wonderful silent auction items along with inexpensive "treasures," additional food options, and increased participation by the staff and students of St. Francis Elementary School. A date next spring is to be determined.

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

GETTING TO KNOW ST. CLARE OF ASSIS

St. Clare's story continued...

San Damiano, in its earliest years (1212 - 1216), was a charismatic community of women called "to do penance." With the "Form of Life" given to them by Francis, Clare saw herself and her Sisters as belonging to Francis' Order, which had been given Papal approval by Pope Innocent III in 1209. She desired a life like Francis, following the poor and humble Christ, sharing the life of the poor through manual labor, attending to the suffering and poverty around her, and living a life of prayer and poverty.

It was not long before Clare was asked to accept the title of abbess at the insistence of the Bishop and Francis. While she did submit, she never used the term and she lived her life among her sisters as one who served.

She requested of Pope Innocent III the "Privilege of Poverty" and received it in 1216, which stated that "No one can compel you to receive possessions." Other monasteries of women at that time would be expected to own property to provide a reliable source of income. Clare chose instead reliance on the work of their hands, the alms received through the begging of the Friars, and God's Povidence. For Clare it was not negotiable; she defended the Privilege to theday she died. Perhaps that Privilege allowed her to think that the "Foundation" was secure from interference in its way of life.

Within two years Clare and her Sisters would be faced with the Rule of Hugolino, an adapted form of the Benedictine Rule. For Clare and her Sisters, two central points were missing from that Form of Life: the pursuit of Gospel poverty inspired by Francis and dependence on the Friars. And so a struggle began for Clare that was to continue throughout the remainder of her life. In 1227, Hugolino was elected to the papacy, and chose the name Gregory IX. He was a great supporter of female religious during the Middle Ages. However he was not happy with the intense poverty embraced by Clare and her sisters and attempted to dispense her from following her ideal. Clare responded that she would never wish to be absolved from following Christ. He finally relented and in 1228 he renewed her



Privilege of Poverty.

Within a short period of time, others joined her: Benvenuta from Perugia, Pacifica, who had been a frequent visitor at her home since childhood, even her mother, Ortulana, and sister Beatrice. In the sixth chapter of her Form of Life, Clare relates that Francis kept an eye on her small community and when he saw that they had no fear of poverty, hard work, trial, or contempt of the world, he provided them with a "form of life." It was a simple statement describing the Trinitarian foundation of the life at San Damiano, as well as the close ties that would bind the Poor Ladies with Francis and his brothers.




