




The Franciscan Saints

Each week between August 11, the Feast of St. Clare, and October 4, the Feast of St. Francis, we will highlight an individual who was inspired by the humility, simplicity of life, closeness to the poor, and spirit of prayer of St. Francis and St. Clare. These stories are found in the book The Franciscan Saints by Robert Ellsberg.



ST. LOUIS OF ANJOU Franciscan Bishop (1274–1297)

Charles II, King of Naples and Sicily, was taken prisoner in a battle with the King of Aragon. To secure his release, Charles surrendered his three sons. Thus, Louis remained a prisoner in Barcelona for seven years. Impressed by the Franciscan friars who tutored him, Louis vowed one day to join them. That day came when Pope Boniface VIII appointed him Bishop of Toulouse. Louis agreed on condition he could make a religious profession among the Friars Minor, thereby fulfilling his childhood dream. Clothed in a tattered habit, he appeared on foot in his new bishopric. Stripping the episcopal palace of all luxury, he set an example of simplicity for the whole diocese. But he hated the burden of office, and after three months asked for permission to resign, which was denied. He soon fell ill and died a few months later on August 19, 1297. Louis was canonized in 1397. The famous mission of San Louis Obispo in California was named after him.




