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

The Franciscan Saints

Each week between August 11, the Feast of St. Clare, and October 4, the Feast of St. Francis, we will highlight an individual who was inspired by the humility, simplicity of life, closeness to the poor, and spirit of prayer of St. Francis and St. Clare. These stories are found in the book The Franciscan Saints by Robert Ellsberg.

BLESSED LOUISA OF SAVOY (1461-1503)

(widow and Poor Clare)



Louisa was born into the highest circle of Nobility. Her father was the duke of Savoy, while on her mother's side her uncle was the king of France. A pious child, she dreamed of entering religious life. Instead, when she was seventeen, her uncle arranged her marriage to a young nobleman. The marriage proved a happy one. Louisa engaged in a range of charitable activities, from the care for widows and orphans to the nursing of victims of the plague. When she was 27 her husband died. After a period of mourning she put on the habit of a Franciscan tertiary and distributed her fortune. After two years she entered a convent of Poor Clares in Orbe. There she spent the rest of her life in prayer and poverty. She died on July 24, 1503 and was beatified in 1839. "Farewell my beloved sisters, I am going into Paradise. It is beautiful there."

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, as to **console**; to be understood, as to **understand**; to be loved, as to **love**; for it is in giving that we **receive**, it is in pardoning that we are **pardoned**, and it is in dying that we are **born to eternal life.**






