

BLESSED JOHN DUNS SCOTUS Franciscan Theologian

(CA. 1266-1308) John Duns was called Scotus on account of his birth in Scotland. He entered the Franciscans at 15 and was later ordained a priest. After studies in Oxford and Paris, he went on to hold teaching positions in Parish and Cologne, where he was acclaimed as one of the greatest of the Scholastic theologians. Duns Scotus defined God as infinite love. He taught that incarnatioin was not required as payment for sin, it was willed through eternity as an expression of God's love, and hence God's desire for consummated union with creation.

Duns Scotus died on November 8, 1308. He was beatified in 1993.

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, as to **console**; to be understood, as to **understand**; to be loved, as to **love**; for it is in giving that we **receive**, it is in pardoning that we are **pardoned**, and it is in dying that we are **born to eternal life.**




APOSTLE'S CREED
